
Community-Engaged Fellows

CCESL began piloting Scholar Shop in the 2012-13 academic year and originally called the program "Science Shop." The name was updated to Scholar Shop in the 2015-16 academic year to be more inclusive and convey that the projects could be broad in nature. For the first five years of the Scholar Shop program, a CCESL Graduate Research Assistant (GRA) served as the Scholar Shop Coordinator. In the last two years, the Community-Engaged Fellows have helped facilitate the program. The program provides a critical leadership opportunity for the Fellows, many of whom have interests in higher education, large systems, and community change.
